

## **2022 Primary Election Highlights**

### Election by the Numbers

Over 26% of eligible voters voted in this election. This is higher turnout than three of the last four gubernatorial primary elections but lower than the 2006 Primary Election. In-person voting continues to be the primary way voters vote, with 65% of the participating voters voting in person. Most voters voted on election day (47%) with 17% voting during early voting.

Turnout trends by early voting day mirrored prior elections. The busiest days were the final two days, when over almost 78,000 voters voted, and the slowest days were Saturday and Sunday. Voting on election day was spread over 1,500 locations statewide.

Before the 2020 elections, turnout by mail was around 6-8% of total turnout. About 35% of voters who voted in the 2022 Primary Election voted by mail. Almost 500,000 ballot packets were sent, almost two-thirds of these packets were sent to voters who opted to join the “permanent absentee voting list.” and almost 70% of those sent were voted and returned.

More data, including precinct level results, will be posted on our [online Press Room](#) in the coming days. We are still collecting and analyzing data and will include more data and analysis in a forthcoming comprehensive report of the election.

### In Person Voting

There were 96 early voting centers and over 1,500 election day polling places. These voting locations served over 646,000 voters.

The busiest early voting centers were consistent over the eight days. Bowie Gymnasium saw the most voters on seven of the eight days. Other busy locations were Southern Regional Tech and Recreation Center (Prince George's), Randallstown Community Center and Perry Hall High School (Baltimore County), The League for People with Disabilities and Public Safety Training Center (Baltimore City), and McFaul Activity Center (Harford County). Over these eight days, over 2,900 individuals used the same day registration process to register and vote and almost 600 voters updated their address and voted the ballot for their new address.

Violent thunderstorms passed through the State during early voting, resulting in at least ten early voting centers and two local boards losing power. Power was quickly restored to some centers, others ran on back-up generators, and others implemented contingency plans to stay open using back-up battery power in the election equipment. Two early voting centers in Prince George's County - College Park Community Center and Rollingcrest-Chillum Community Center - opened and operated without power (or air conditioning) until the following evening.

Elections are difficult to administer in the best of circumstances, but without power in July, it is even more difficult. I commend the local boards for making sure that the centers opened on time and the election judges who worked in facilities without air conditioning on a hot and muggy July day. One election director deployed a portable toilet for the election judges at one early voting center. I would also like to recognize the partnership with and support of the Maryland Department of Emergency Management and the State's utility providers. These relationships are critical and their responsiveness to our many escalations is appreciated.

In the days leading up to the election, every local board of elections reported a higher than normal “call out” rate of election judges. Some experienced judges contracted COVID-19 while working early voting, while other election judges reported that they were unable to serve at the last minute. These last-minute cancellations required that the local boards revisit assignments and where possible, shuffle assignments so

all election day polling places could open. This led to the delayed opening of a handful of election day voting locations as some polling places had fewer or less experienced election judges. As explained later in this report, we are expanding our election judge recruitment efforts to support the upcoming general election.

### Mail-in Voting

As mentioned above, almost 500,000 ballot packets were mailed and over 345,000 (or 69.1%) were voted and returned. Ballot packets to requesting military and overseas voters were mailed before the required 45th day before the primary election (June 4). The first round of ballot packets for domestic, civilian voters - over 340,000 packets - mailed over several days starting on June 9. The vendor mailed the final round of ballot packets on July 12, and the local boards handled subsequent ballot packet mailings.

While the vendor performed well, we implemented changes during this election to prevent two issues from recurring - the printing of voters' party affiliations on return envelopes, and inadvertent mailing of duplicate ballot packets.

Upon learning that the first shipment of mail-in ballot packets had abbreviations of voters' party affiliations on return envelopes, we instructed the vendor to immediately stop printing this information and no subsequent ballot packets included voters' party abbreviations. We have already implemented a new process for reviewing and approving the data layout on the mail-in ballot packets for future elections.

Immediately upon learning that the vendor had sent less than 1,000 duplicate ballot packets (less than 0.2% of the almost 500,000 ballot packets sent in the 2022 Primary Election), we immediately addressed it with the vendor. The vendor identified the cause of the duplicate ballot issuance, corrected the issue to prevent a similar occurrence in the future, and promptly sent a letter to all voters who received duplicate ballots, instructing them how to proceed with the duplicate ballot.

### Voter Education

During the weeks leading up to the primary election, the statewide voter education campaign focused on registering to vote, the three ways to vote (early, by mail or drop box, or on election day), and the various deadlines associated with each. In the digital campaign, we built awareness around changes triggered by the redistricting process, updating voter information, and finding polling locations. Our election-specific webpage - [www.elections.maryland.gov/2022](http://www.elections.maryland.gov/2022) - was the central communications hub for the campaign and included iconography consistent with the paid media campaign.

Highlights from the campaign are:

- The digital ads garnered over 16.8 million impressions, over 230,000 clicks, and almost 8 million video plays.
- The same ads drove over 170,330 users to our 2022 Election landing page, and the average time spent on the page was significant at 2:03 minutes.
- Facebook & Instagram proved the most successful means of driving impression volume, while Google Search proved the most successful means of driving engaged traffic to the site.
- Across channels, users residing in the Central region of Maryland were most likely to click through ads to the site when presented with them.
- Users grew increasingly likely to click through ads as the election approached.
- There were TV, radio and print ads around the State. While there was an equal number of ads by region, the number of them was limited due to the limited budget for this campaign.

We will include more data and analysis about the campaign in the forthcoming comprehensive report of the election.

### Election Systems & Operations

Following the recent redistricting process, local boards of elections have assigned more than 4 million voters to newly drawn districts in compliance with Maryland's latest congressional and legislative maps. Despite the complexity inherent in every statewide redistricting, more than 99.9% of all registered voters in Maryland were assigned to the correct legislative and congressional districts at the conclusion of the process. After a statewide review, we identified voters who were placed in the incorrect district and worked with the local boards to provide the affected voters with the correct district information and if necessary, a new mail-in ballot. We also supported a local board during the canvassing to make sure that the voter's correct ballot was counted.

The voting system and electronic pollbooks worked well. The equipment is currently under lockdown until the election has been certified and the time to request a recount or contest the election has passed. Once the equipment is released, the local boards will perform post-election maintenance on units with reported issues.

The operations support worked as planned during early voting and election day. The deployment of the election support dashboard and SBE's help desk tracking system and the onsite support at the SBE office on election day went very smoothly. The PMO is now closing out the helpdesk and dashboard in preparation for the upcoming general election.

On election night, four local boards - Baltimore City and Calvert, Montgomery and Prince George's Counties - were unable to upload all of their memory devices. This happens when election judges do not follow the local boards' instructions on removing the memory devices from the voting unit and storing the memory devices for the election night return to the office. I requested that the four local boards provide information about the memory devices that were not uploaded on election night.

- In Baltimore City, election judges in nine different polling places did not return twelve memory devices as instructed.
  - One memory device was found in the locked scanner
  - Election judges returned three memory devices in the wrong transport case
  - The Baltimore City Board of Elections had three devices election night but did not upload them. One device would not upload, so a new device was programmed, the ballots from that precinct were rescanned, and the results from the new device were uploaded
  - Two devices were not located. New devices were programmed, the ballots from these precincts were rescanned, and the results from the new devices were uploaded. One of the devices was located after the rescanning and uploading.
- In Calvert County, election judges in two different polling places left the memory devices in scanners. Both memory devices were found inside the locked scanners.
- We are awaiting Montgomery County's response.
- In Prince George's County, election judges in five polling places left the memory devices in scanners. All ten memory devices (two from each polling place) were found inside the locked scanners.

### Post Election Audits

After each primary election, we perform an automated ballot tabulation audit. The automated audit of ballot images from the 2022 Primary Election is complete. Before certifying election results, each local board received five reports comparing the voting system's results against the results from the independent tabulation performed by the automated audit software for all ballots cast during early voting and on election day.

These reports showed that:

1. The voting system and audit system tabulated the same number of ballots (cards cast).
2. Any differences between the two systems' results were less than 0.5%.
3. The voting system accurately tabulated the results.

After the completion of the canvasses and prior to today's meeting, all ballot images, including mail-in and provisional ballots, were re-tabulated and a second set of reports were issued. These reports confirmed that the voting system accurately tabulated the ballot images from all canvasses. Reports from the comparison of early voting and election day reports are posted on our [website](#), and reports for all results will be posted shortly.

### Recounts

As expected, there were some very close contests, and we are in the midst of the recount phase of the election.

- A recount for the Republican nomination for Harford County's Council District D was conducted on August 2, 2022. The margin of victory - 11 votes or 0.19% - stayed the same.
- Requests for recounts have already been filed for Democratic House of Delegates Legislative Districts 23 and 24, both of which are in Prince George's County. The vote difference for Legislative District 23 is 19 votes, and this is a free recount, as the margin between two candidates is 0.11%). The vote difference for Legislative District 24 is 101 votes; this is not a free recount, as the margin between two candidates is 0.64%. We are awaiting final confirmation on the date of these recounts.
- A recount is expected for the Democratic nomination for the Montgomery County Executive (35 vote difference or 0.03%). This recount is expected to start on August 18, 2022 and continue for several days.
- A recount was also filed for the Democratic nomination for Frederick County Council District 3. The recount is scheduled for August 16, 2022.

While preparing for the recount, the Frederick County Board of Elections discovered a discrepancy in the total number of votes in the certified results and the number of accepted mail-in and provisional ballots. This discovery triggered a further review of the ballots cast in Frederick County. The review found that about 100 ballots were scanned more than once and four provisional ballots had not been presented at a canvass.

On August 10, 2022, the Frederick County Board of Elections decertified the primary election results and with support from other local boards, rescanned over 16,500 mail-in and provisional ballots. We arranged for additional voting equipment to be delivered to the Frederick County Board of Elections and provided on-site technical support during the rescan. After the rescan, the Frederick County Board of Elections recertified the election results. The margin between the two candidates seeking the Democratic nomination for Council District 3 was 3 votes but after the rescan, it is 1 vote or 0.02%.

### Call Center

The call center continues to be an important part of service to the Maryland voters. The call center will provide help desk support to voters calling SBE and several local boards through the upcoming general election. As of August 9, 2022, the call center handled 64,459 calls.

### Conclusion

I would like to recognize election officials across the State for successfully administering this election. It certainly had its challenges with a changed election date, shorter than usual time to implement redistricting plans, and return to a "normal" election with a significant increase in the number of mail-in ballots. All elections require a tremendous amount of work, but this one required even more than normal - and

Maryland's election officials did what was necessary to administer this election successfully. I would like to publicly thank them for their service and dedication and their family for supporting their work.

## **Election Reform & Management**

### Election Judge Recruitment

We are currently working with several non-profit agencies, including Civic Alliance, Democracy Works, and Power the Polls, to promote recruiting more election judges for the upcoming general election. Additionally, we have reached out to Vet the Vote, a group encouraging veterans to serve in elections. We are also continuing to work with The University of Maryland's Civic Innovation Center (CiVIC) to recruit students and staff through the University of Maryland System for the upcoming general election.

We and the local boards will participate in the U.S. Election Assistance Commission's (EAC) Help America Vote Day on August 16. The EAC designated this day to promote service as an election judge, and the Governor has proclaimed August 16 as Help America Vote Day as well. Power the Polls will also be working to amplify that effort for that day. They have also been directly connected with those jurisdictions with reported regular shortages to assist in finding judges that are willing to serve in their areas.

For the primary election, the State Department of Budget and Management authorized 16 hours of administrative leave for permanent and contractual employees. This was a very successful recruitment incentive, as it offered a big last-minute boost of State employees that volunteered to serve. We hope that the offer will be extended for early voting and election day for the upcoming general election.

## **Voter Registration**

### MDVOTERS

The August 8.7 development release includes security enhancements that address Maryland's Department of Information Technology (DoIT) and The National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) security requirements. The recent release addresses improved ballot processing for web delivery ballots and application performance enhancements regarding processing time.

### Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC)

Maryland receives ERIC data on a monthly basis. On even-numbered months (February, April, etc.) we receive the In-State Updates, Cross-State, and NCOA (National Change of Address) reports for processing. Odd months we receive In-State Duplicate and Social Security Administration Death files for processing. For more information on ERIC, please visit [www.ericstates.org](http://www.ericstates.org).

## **Candidacy and Campaign Finance (CCF) Division**

### Candidacy

The deadline for petition and non-principal political party candidates to file a Certificate of Nomination, petition and pay the filing fee for candidacy was August 2, 2022 at 5 pm. The only remaining way to become a candidate is to be a write-in candidate. Write-in candidates do not need to file a certificate of candidacy in person.

## Campaign Finance

### *2022 Pre-Primary 2*

The 2022 Pre-Primary 2 was due on July 8, 2022 by 11:59 pm. Over 82% of the committee filed on time, and as of August 12, nearly 93% of the required committees have filed their report. We sent to those committees that have not yet filed a late fee notice. The maximum late fee penalty for a failure to file is \$1,000.

Pursuant to Election Law Article §13-332.1, the State Board of Elections will not issue a certificate of nomination to any candidate that failed to file a campaign finance report or failed to pay late fees. The deadline to correct the failure to file is August 16, 2022. A candidate who does not rectify the failure to file by the deadline will be deemed to have declined the nomination and will not appear on the general election ballot. The central committee can fill the vacancy created by the declination.

The Pre-General 1 Campaign Finance Report is due on August 30, 2022.

### *State Public Financing Program*

The certified gubernatorial ticket received a total of \$879,418.76 in public funds. The committee did not make any requests for funds in July. The Division has begun the comprehensive audit for the committee's records and finances.

### *County Public Financing Programs*

Montgomery County: As of July 31, there are 20 certified candidates in the program. Six candidates received the maximum public contribution allowed for a primary election. The program has disbursed \$1,077,032 in June and \$122,619 in July with a disbursement total of \$3,455,722.

Howard County: There are five certified candidates in the program. All five candidates have advanced to the general election. As of July 31, the program has disbursed a total of \$724,766.79.

## Enforcement

Here are the enforcement actions for the July:

- On July 28, 2022, Adam Cunningham for State Senate paid \$250.00 for a failure to include authority line.
- On July 26, 2022, Friends of Courtney Watson paid \$200.0 for failure to maintain account books - contributions and failure to maintain account books – expenditures.

## **Project Management Office (PMO)**

### Inventory Management

SBE's FY22 Inventory Auditing of equipment and supplies statewide ended on June 30, with 96.44% of the inventory being audited. Most of the equipment items not audited are those going through the disposal process at SBE's Central Warehouse.

### Central Warehouse

The Central Warehouse team continued its work on numerous tasks related to the election, including sending and receiving the ballot dropboxes and the receipt and checking in of the new pollbook printers. The team is also managing the use of the warehouse space by other election teams and trainers.

### Document and Records Management

The PMO continued the review responses to the previously issued request for information on a document management system. In addition, a significant amount of effort went into fulfilling the State's requirements for records management.

Baltimore City Relocation

Continued to work with the Baltimore City Board of Elections on their potential relocation plans.

**DECLARATION OF QUORUM PRESENT**

Mr. Voelp called the meeting to order at 2:01 pm and declared that a quorum was present.

**ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA**

There were no additions to the agenda.

**APPROVAL OF PROPOSED AND EMERGENCY REGULATIONS TO COMAR 33.07.04 (ELECTION DAY ACTIVITIES), 33.11.03 AND 33.11.05 (ABSENTEE BALLOTS), and 33.16.06 (PROVISIONAL VOTING)**

Ms. Dorsey presented proposed and emergency amendments to COMAR 33.07.04.02. The proposed amendments are:

1. 33.07.04.02 (Election Day Activities – Order and Decorum — Cell Phone, Pages, Cameras, etc.): The proposed amendment to section B of this regulation allows for voters to use the Digital Wallet that the Maryland Department of Transportation recently began using as a method of identification or proof of residency, when required, in the voting locations. It also allows voters to use electronic documents to provide proof of residency.

In response to a question from Ms. Woodward, Ms. Dorsey confirmed that the proposed amendments do not allow the use of a cell phone or other electronic device while voting, or for any purpose other than as a method of identification or proof of residency.

Ms. Woodward made a motion to approve the proposed amendments to COMAR 33.07.04.02 for both the emergency and normal promulgation process. Mr. Williams seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

Ms. Charlson presented proposed amendments to COMAR 33.11.03.06, 33.11.05.04, and 33.16.06.04. The proposed amendments are:

2. 33.11.03.06 (Absentee Ballots — Issuance and Return — Return of Ballot): The proposed amendments to section C of this regulation clarifies the timeframe by which a local board must contact a voter who returned a ballot but failed to sign the oath, and the methods by which a voter may provide their signature. An additional amendment adds a missing closed parenthesis. Ms. Charlson explained that [HB 862](#) and [SB 163](#) (2022) require the local boards

to contact voters who returned a mail-in ballot but did not sign the oath. The State Board previously adopted regulations requiring the same, but HB 863 and SB 163 included a different timeline for contacting voters and defined the ways voters may provide a signature. Although these bills were vetoed, the State Board has the authority to amend its existing regulations related to curing, and the proposed changes to 33.11.03.06C align the regulation with the two bills.

Mr. Funn made a motion to approve the proposed amendments to COMAR 33.11.03.06 for both the emergency and normal promulgation process. Mr. Williams seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

3. 33.11.05.04 (Absentee Ballots — Canvass of Ballots- Rejecting Ballots — Ballot Rejection — Multiple Ballots from the Same Individual) and 33.16.06.04 (Provisional Voting — Canvass of Ballots- Rejecting Ballots — Ballot Rejection — Multiple Ballots from the Same Individual): The proposed amendments require the local board of canvassers to count the absentee ballot (mail-in ballot) if a voter returns a mail-in ballot and a provisional ballot. These proposed changes are identical to the changes adopted as emergency changes for the 2020 General Election.

In response to a question from Mr. Williams regarding what would happen if a voter returned a mail-in ballot but voted provisionally before the mail-in ballot was counted, Ms. Charlson stated that the local board would reject the mail-in ballot if it was received after the provisional ballot was counted.

Mr. Williams proposed amending the proposed regulations to clarify that the local board of canvassers should reject a mail-in ballot from a voter if it is received after a provisional ballot from the voter is counted. Mr. Funn, Ms. Woodward, and Mr. Voelp all concurred with Mr. Williams' proposal.

Mr. Williams made a motion to approve the proposed amendments to COMAR 33.11.05.04 with his amendment for both the emergency and normal promulgation process. Mr. Funn seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

Mr. Williams made a motion to approve the proposed amendments to COMAR 33.16.06.04 with his amendment for both the emergency and normal promulgation process. Mr. Funn seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

### **APPROVAL OF EMERGENCY CHANGE TO POLLING PLACES FOR BALTIMORE CITY, PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, AND SAINT MARY'S COUNTY**

Ms. Duncan presented requests from the Baltimore City, Prince George's County, and Saint Mary's County Boards of Elections for emergency polling place changes. Those changes are:

1. Baltimore City- Ms. Duncan presented a request from the Baltimore City Board of Elections to replace two polling places that were vandalized. They are proposing to replace Sarah Roach School #73 with the Hilton Recreation Center for precincts 20-007 and 20-008, and the Lillian Jones Recreation Center with the Harlen Recreation Center for precincts 15-018 and 16-005. SBE recommended approving this request.

In response to questions from Mr. Williams, Ms. Duncan confirm that changes to polling places only need to be approved by the State Board if the change is made within 13 weeks of an election.

Ms. Charlson stated that she was informed by Armstead Jones, Election Director for the Baltimore City Board of Elections, that the Board had not yet approved the change in location.

2. Prince George's County- Ms. Duncan presented four requests from the Prince George's County Board of Elections to replace polling places. Those requests are to replace:
  - a. Patuxent Elementary School with the Patuxent Community Center, for the consolidated precinct 03-002 and 03-008. This relocation is necessary because the Patuxent Elementary School is under construction and therefore is no longer available for use as a polling place for the primary election;
  - b. Clinton United Methodist Church with Surratsville High School for precinct 09-008. This relocation is necessary because the Clinton United Methodist Church has not opened up since the pandemic;
  - c. First Bethel Baptist Church to Kettering Middle School Cafeteria for precinct 13-013. This relocation is necessary because the First Bethel Baptist Church has rented their building to another business which has declined to be a polling place; and
  - d. E. Michael Roll Municipal Building with the City of District Heights Family & Youth Services Bureau for precinct 06-011. This relocation is necessary because the services of the Municipal Building have been temporarily relocated to the Family & Youth Services Bureau building.

SBE recommended approving these requests.

In response to a question from the Board, Ms. Alexander stated that at its last meeting, the Prince George's County Board of Elections voted to give her the authority to make the necessary changes to polling places as needed.

3. Saint Mary's County- Ms. Duncan presented a request from the Saint Mary's County Board of Elections to replace the Greenview Knolls Elementary School polling place with the Esperanza Middle School Gym. This relocation is necessary because Greenview Knoll Elementary School is under construction which will not be completed in time for the primary election. The request noted that the Saint Mary's Board of Elections approved this change. SBE recommended approving this request.

Ms. Woodward made a motion to approve the emergency polling place changes as presented for Prince George's and Saint Mary's Counties. Mr. Williams seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

Mr. Williams made a motion to conditionally approve the emergency polling place changes as presented for Baltimore City, dependent upon approval by the Baltimore City Board of Elections. Ms. Woodward seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

## **ANNOUNCEMENT**

Ms. Charlson introduced Mr. Kobrin, who is the new Assistant Attorney General for SBE.

### **CLOSED SESSION - LITIGATION ADVICE**

Mr. Voelp requested a motion to close the board meeting under several provisions of §3-305(b) Mr. Voelp requested a motion to close the board meeting under (b)(7) and (8), which permit closing a meeting to receive advice from counsel and consult with staff about pending or potential litigation, respectively, of §3-305(b) of the General Provisions Article. Mr. Williams made a motion to convene in closed session under General Provisions Article, §3-305(b)(7) and (8), and Mr. Funn seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion having passed, the Board met in closed session in accordance with exemptions defined in (b)(7) and (8) of Section 3-305 of the Open Meetings Act to receive advice from counsel and consult with staff about pending or potential litigation. The closed session began at 2:45 pm. Mr. Voelp, Mr. Funn, Mr. Miller, Ms. Woodward, and Mr. Williams attended the closed meeting. In addition to the board members, Ms. Lamone, Mr. Lewis, Mr. Kobrin, Ms. Charlson, and Ms. Duncan attended the meeting. The board members consulted with staff about pending or potential litigation and counsel provided legal advice. No actions were taken.

There was a motion to adjourn the closed meeting, it passed unanimously. The closed meeting adjourned about 3:45 pm.

**DECLARATION OF QUORUM PRESENT**

Mr. Voelp called the meeting to order at 2:32 pm and declared that a quorum was present.

**ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA**

There were no additions to the agenda.

**APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES: OPEN MEETINGS ON JUNE 2, 2022 AND CLOSED MEETINGS ON JUNE 2, 2022 AND JUNE 23, 2022**

Mr. Funn made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 2, 2022, open and closed meetings and the minutes from the closed meeting on June 23, 2022 meeting. Ms. Woodward seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

Mr. Voelp requested that only highlights of the Administrator's Report be presented verbally.

**Announcements & Important Meetings**

Election Directors' Meetings

We hosted Election Directors' meetings weekly in June. The topics of discussion cover the current election preparation tasks and any specific topics or questions requested by the Election Directors. As the minutes of the meetings are prepared, they will be distributed with the County Bulletin.

**2022 Election Preparation Activities**

Voter Registration & Updates Deadline

Ms. Charlson stated that today is the deadline to register to vote and update voter information. Individuals can register or update information [online](#) or submit a paper [application](#). The online system is available until 11:59 pm on June 28, and paper applications must be dropped off or postmarked on or before June 28. Although individuals can register to vote during early voting and on election day or update their address during early voting and vote the ballot for their new address, we encourage voters to submit their registration or updates on

or before June 28. Registering or updating by June 28 will make the voting process quicker and easier.

On July 2, MDVOTERS will be locked down at 11:30 a.m. so the voter registration team can prepare for the precinct register pull. This task generates the data of eligible voters which is used to populate the electronic poll books.

### Call Center

Since the 2010 elections, we have used a call center to assist us in responding to the voters of Maryland. These services began with assisting SBE and then several of the larger local boards. In 2020, the call center answered over 182,600 inquiries for SBE and about 18 local boards. For the 2022 elections, we are utilizing this service to help our voters get answers to their questions. Currently, the call center is handling calls for SBE and thirteen local boards. As of June 24, 2022, a total of 32,024 calls have been handled.

### Logic and Accuracy Testing (L&A)

Ms. Charlson reported that Logic and Accuracy testing of the voting equipment for the primary election has begun. The local boards test all equipment that will be used during early voting, on election day, or during the canvassing of mail-in and provisional ballots. L&A testing on voting equipment to be deployed for early voting must be completed by July 5, 2022. The L&A testing of voting equipment to be deployed for election day will be completed by July 9, 2022.

### Mail-in Voting

Ms. McLaughlin reported that the deadline to request a mail-in ballot is fast approaching. The specific deadline depends on how the voter wants to receive their ballot. If the voter wants to receive the ballot by mail, the deadline is July 12. If the voter wants to receive the ballot via a link in an email (aka web delivery), the deadline is July 15. Voters can request a mail-in ballot [online](#) or by submitting a [paper request](#). These deadlines are "receipt" deadlines, meaning that the local board must receive the application on or before July 12. A request postmarked on July 12 is not timely.

As of June 27, 363,533 ballot packets were mailed to voters. Over 44,000 emails were sent to voters who requested ballots via web delivery. We have been sending various texts and emails about ballot statuses. We updated inserts as needed, provided corrected oaths to a small number of voters who received the incorrect oath via web delivery, and are supporting the local boards with issuing new ballots for voters assigned to incorrect districts.

All ballot boxes are in place, and the local boards are emptying the boxes at least daily.

### Election Judge Recruitment

Ms. Dorsey reported that election judge recruitment continues by both SBE and the local boards. The Department of Budget and Management granted up to 8 hours of administrative leave to State employees who serve as election judges. We have also reached out to the Maryland Judiciary, Maryland Department of Transportation, and the University System of Maryland to request that leave be granted to State employees who serve as election judges. We are also working with the Governor's office to promote service as an election judge. Similarly, SBE has contacted several organizations, including Civic Alliance and Democracy Works, that partner with private employers to encourage employees to serve as election workers. Statewide, roughly 25%

of the election judge positions are vacant, with Baltimore City and Baltimore County reporting the biggest need.

### Voter Education

Ms. Charlson noted that the voter education campaign is now promoting the voting timeline - early voting and election day - and the traditional media part of the campaign - TV, radio and print - is getting started. Here are some campaign highlights:

- The campaign has driven a total of 49,210 users to the SBE's landing page leading to 92,545 total pageviews across the site. This means that many users visit multiple pages when they visit the landing page.
- Over 90% of users are classified as "new," meaning we are reaching users who have not accessed the site's voter resources in the past 30 days.
- Users spent an average of over 02:00 on-page and views have increased 297.17% since June 1, 2022.
- Google Search traffic has seen the highest overall on-site engagement, and Google Search users are most likely to click-through ads.
- Facebook and Instagram ads have reached over 1.7 million users.

### Election Operations Support

Mr. Ross stated that the Project Management Office (PMO) continues its work on the logistics and planning for the primary election operations support that includes the use of an election helpdesk system and the setup of an election operations center on Election day.

### **Voter Registration**

#### MDVOTERS Audits

Monthly audits of voter registration data continue to verify compliance with federal and State laws governing voter registration. The monthly audits include review of the local boards of elections' processing of Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) reports, Department of Health (DHMH) death records, Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) felony records, and the processing of overall voter registration records. Follow up is conducted with the local boards to ensure all corrections are completed and to address any training issues. On a monthly basis, a minimum of 144 audits are conducted.

#### Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) - Membership

ERIC's membership now has 31 states plus the District of Columbia. For more information on ERIC, please visit <https://ericstates.org/>.

#### ERIC Files

We are now receiving ERIC data on a monthly basis. On even months (February, April, etc), we receive the In-State Updates, Cross-State, and NCOA (National Change of Address) reports for processing. Odd months bring us the In-State Duplicate and Social Security Administration Death files for processing. Now that we are within 90 days prior to an election and prohibited from sending list maintenance mailings, we will receive the In-State Duplicate and SSA Death files on a monthly basis.

## **Candidacy and Campaign Finance (CCF) Division**

### Candidacy

Mr. DeMarinis noted that the deadline for Petition and non-principal political party candidates to file a Declaration of Intent for candidacy is July 5, 2022 at 5 pm. Filings are still by appointment.

### Campaign Finance

#### *2022 Pre-Primary 1*

Mr. DeMarinis reported that the 2022 Pre-Primary 1 was due on June 14, 2022 by 11:59 pm. Almost 81% of the committees filed on time, and as of June 24, 90% of the required committees have filed their report. We sent to those committees that have not yet filed a late fee notice. The maximum late fee penalty for a failure to file is \$1,000.

The Pre-Primary 2 Campaign Finance Report is due on July 8, 2022.

#### *State Public Financing Program*

In order to qualify for a public contribution, the candidate must raise \$120,000 from 1,500 Maryland residents. The certified gubernatorial ticket has qualified for a total of \$879,418.76 in public funds and received \$76,121.08 in public funds in June. Another gubernatorial ticket filed a notice of intent but failed to qualify by the deadline.

#### *County Public Financing Programs*

Montgomery County: As of May 31, there are 19 certified candidates in the program. 8 additional candidates have filed a notice of intent to participate. The certificate deadline to qualify for a public contribution was June 4. The program has disbursed \$147,881 in May with a disbursement total of \$2,256,071.

Howard County: There are five certified candidates in the program. Two candidates filed a notice of intent to participate in the program but failed to meet the requirements. As of June 24, the program has disbursed a total of \$603,696.65.

### Website Activity

In May, the MD Campaign Reporting Information System (MD CRIS) website was visited by 309,792 individuals for an average of nearly 10 individuals per day. Additionally, it had 2,114,443 hits. Each viewer looked at an average of approximately 5.5 page views per day. The Business Contribution Disclosure System (BCDS) website had 1,029,799 hits, with 108,346 visitors with an average of nearly 8.5 page views per day.

### Enforcement

1. Johnson, George Committee to Elect paid \$500.00 on June 16, 2022, for failure to maintain account books.
2. Moore, Tom Friends of paid \$250.00 on June 22, 2022, for failure to maintain account books and records.

In the board package, there is a memo and information related to five denials for Title 14 waiver requests. The information on these denials is informational, as no board action is required on denials. There are no waiver requests to grant.

## **Voting Systems**

### New Electronic Pollbook

Mr. Satterfield noted that work on implementing the new electronic pollbooks continues. We are simultaneously in the Project Initiation and Planning and the Analysis and Design phases. The project initiation and planning phase is on schedule for completion in the second quarter of 2022, and the analysis and design phase is on schedule for completion in the third quarter of 2022.

### Voting System Replacement Project

Mr. Satterfield reported explained that the current voting system lease ends March 2023, and there is one option remaining. If exercised, the final option ends March 2025. We are currently gathering information about current and future voting system solutions and are on schedule to complete this phase by the third quarter of 2022.

### **Project Management Office (PMO)**

#### Inventory Management

Mr. Ross noted that SBE's FY22 inventory audit of equipment and supplies statewide started on February 1. Currently, between SBE and the local boards, 96.02% of the inventory has been audited. June 30, 2022 is the end date for all the inventory auditing.

#### Central Warehouse

The Central Warehouse team continues its work on numerous tasks related to the upcoming election with the receiving and shipping out of equipment and supplies.

#### Document Management

SBE continues its review of the seventeen responses received from the Request for Information (RFI) request for a document management system. The next step will be to generate the requirements for the document management system Request for Proposals (RFP) expected to go out in the next fiscal year.

#### Baltimore City Relocation

The PMO continued to work with the Baltimore City Board of Elections on their relocation plans.

### **ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL'S REPORT**

Mr. Kobrin gave the following updates:

1. *WinRed, Inc. v. Ellison, et al.*, No. 21-cv-1575 (D. Minn.). On July 7, 2021, WinRed, Inc. – a federal PAC created to assist Republican Party candidates – filed a lawsuit against the Attorneys General of Connecticut, New York, Maryland, and Minnesota (the “State AGs”), seeking a declaration that State consumer protection statutes and regulations are preempted by federal law, to the extent that these State laws are being enforced to regulate the use of pre-checked recurring contribution boxes for solicitations for federal offices. WinRed had received letters from the defendants requesting information and documents regarding its use of pre-checked boxes in that context. (It is now public that ActBlue – the PAC formed to assist Democratic Party candidates – has received a similar request from the same State AGs but has not joined this lawsuit.) On July 27, 2021, WinRed filed a motion for preliminary injunction against enforcement of subpoenas served by the State AGs. On July 29, 2021, the State AGs moved to dismiss the complaint. Oral argument on both motions took place on November 2, 2021. On January 26, 2022, the Court issued an order denying Plaintiff's motion for preliminary injunction and granting the defendants' motion to dismiss and dismissed the Complaint. WinRed has appealed the dismissal to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth

Circuit. On March 25, 2022, WinRed filed its opening brief. The Appellees' response was filed in late April. WinRed filed its reply brief on May 23, 2022. The Court is in the process of scheduling the appeal for oral argument.

2. *Connors v. State of Maryland, et al.*, No. C-02-CV-21-001282 (Cir. Ct. A.A. Cnty.). On September 23, 2021, the Plaintiff filed a lawsuit challenging the SBE's disclosure of personalized voter information on lists of registered voters without obtaining voters' consent. She alleges that SBE's practices of (i) disclosing information beyond just the names of voters on the voter list, (ii) disclosing the voter list to non-Maryland registered voters, (iii) transmitting the voter list to individuals or organizations who do not swear the oath that the list will only be used for electoral purposes, (iv) failing to ensure that the purpose for which the list is intended to be used by the applicant comports with that requirement, and (v) allowing only some voters to participate in the voter confidentiality program, violates various State and federal laws and constitutional provisions. The plaintiff is seeking, among other things, damages in the amount of \$400,000 for each instance her voter information was disclosed on a voter list transmitted to an applicant and seeks injunctive relief in the form of an order forbidding SBE from disclosing voter information without the affirmative consent of the voter and requiring SBE to issue new voter ID numbers to every Maryland registered voter. The State of Maryland, the State Administrator, and the Governor are named as defendants in the case.

On November 8, 2021, the Defendants filed a motion to dismiss the Complaint. On November 23, 2021, Plaintiff filed an opposition to the motion to dismiss. The motion to dismiss was heard on February 14, 2022. On March 10, 2022, the Circuit Court issued an opinion and order dismissing the Complaint. Ms. Connors did not appeal.

On June 3, 2022, Plaintiff filed a miscellaneous correspondence with the Circuit Court. The correspondence was docketed that same day but does not revive the claim or affect the disposition of the matter in any way. With the time for an appeal having passed, the matter is now final.

3. *Baltimore Cnty. Branch of the NAACP, et al. v. Baltimore Cnty., Md., et al.*, No. 1:21-cv-03232 (D. Md.). On December 21, 2021, the Baltimore County Branch of the NAACP, the League of Women Voters, Common Cause of Maryland, and several individual plaintiffs filed a lawsuit challenging the Baltimore County redistricting map for county council districts, on the ground that it violated section 2 of the Voting Rights Act. Baltimore County, the individual members of the Baltimore County Council, and the Baltimore County Board of Elections were named as defendants. (The individual County Council members have since been dismissed from the case.) On January 19, 2022, the plaintiffs filed a motion for preliminary injunction, and the court entered an order setting a hearing for February 15, 2022 on the plaintiffs' motion. On February 22, 2022, the court ruled in favor of the plaintiffs, and ordered Baltimore County to produce a compliant map by March 9, 2022. On March 9, 2022, Baltimore County filed its proposed remedial map. The Court has asked the plaintiffs to respond to the filing by 5 pm today and will hold a conference with the parties on March 11, 2022 to discuss further proceedings. On March 25, 2022, the Court approved the remedial map proposed by Baltimore County. On May 9, 2022, after reviewing status reports from the parties, the Court dismissed the matter without prejudice, to allow the plaintiffs to bring a challenge to the county map after the July 19, 2022 election if they determine that a challenge is warranted, and to file a motion to attorneys' fees by June 6, 2022.

On June 6, 2022, the plaintiffs filed a Motion for Attorney's Fees and Litigation Expenses. Plaintiffs in their filing promise a memo detailing their fee requests by July 11, 2022.

4. *In the Matter of Seth Wilson*, No. C-02-CV-22-000078 (Cir. Ct. A.A. Cnty.). On January 14, 2022, Seth Wilson, the Chairman of the Washington County Republican Party Central Committee, filed a petition for judicial review of the determination and approval, respectively, by the Washington County Board of Elections and SBE, of the locations for early voting centers in Washington County for the 2022 elections. On January 19, 2022, the agencies were provided notice of the petition for judicial review by the Clerk of the court. On March 22, 2022, the agencies filed administrative records. Mr. Wilson has filed his memorandum of law in support of his petition. The State and Local Boards have filed answering memoranda. Mr. Wilson will likely be filing a reply memorandum within the next two weeks. A hearing on the petition has been scheduled for August 15, 2022.
5. *Paul Corderman v. Shawn Perry*, No. C-21-CV-22-000226 (Cir. Ct. Wash. Cnty.). On March 16, 2022, Senator Paul Corderman sued Shawn Perry, the Maryland State Board of Elections, and the Washington County Board of Elections. Senator Corderman was challenging Mr. Perry's residency and alleged that his name should not appear on the ballot. After a hearing on May 26, 2022, the Court concluded that Mr. Perry established his residency before the deadline to run for office and his name did not need to be removed from the ballot. No appeal has been taken and the matter has been fully resolved.

**APPROVAL OF PROPOSED REGULATIONS TO COMAR 33.11.05.04 (ABSENTEE BALLOTS- CANVASS OF BALLOTS) and 33.16.06.04 (PROVISIONAL VOTING- CANVASS OF BALLOTS)**

Ms. Charlson presented proposed amendments to COMAR 33.15.03.03 and 33.15.03.04. The proposed amendments are:

33.11.05.04 (Absentee Ballots — Canvass of Ballots — Rejecting Ballots — Ballot Rejection — Multiple Ballots from the Same Individual) and 33.16.06.04 (Provisional Voting — Canvass of Ballots- Rejecting Ballots — Ballot Rejection- Multiple Ballots from the Same Individual): Under the proposed changes to 33.11.05.04 and 33.16.06.04, the local board of canvassers will count the absentee ballot (mail-in ballot) if a voter returns a mail-in ballot and a provisional ballot. These proposed changes are identical to the changes adopted as emergency changes for the 2020 General Election.

Ms. Charlson stated that these were the same proposed amendments to COMAR 33.11.05.04 and 33.16.06.04 that were presented to the Board at the June 23, 2022 meeting. However, in reviewing the proposed amendments after the Board had approved them, she realized that the verb "canvassed" should actually be "counted." She explained that canvassing of ballots is a process, while counted is an outcome of canvassing. A ballot that is canvassed can either be accepted (and then counted by the voting machine) or rejected. If the verb used in the regulation was "canvassed," it could lead to the following scenario: A voter's provisional ballot is rejected on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday after the election, and a mail-in ballot from the voter arrives the next day. The emergency regulations would require that the mail-in ballot would still have to be rejected because the provisional ballot was "canvassed." However, if the verb used in the regulation is "counted," a mail-in ballot that arrives after a provisional ballot has been rejected can still be counted.

In response to a question from Mr. Williams, Mr. Voelp explained that using the word "received" instead of "counted" would result in the subsections of both regulations being in contradiction.

Ms. Charlson explained that the timing of when the provisional or mail-in ballot is counted is more important than when the mail-in ballot being received, because a received ballot can still be rejected.

Ms. Woodward made a motion to accept the word “counted” in lieu of “canvassed” as proposed by Ms. Charlson in the approved amendments to COMAR 33.11.05.04 and 33.16.0.04 in the regular and emergency promulgation process. Mr. Funn seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

### **APPROVAL OF FINAL NEW REGULATIONS- COMAR 33.01.07 (DEFINITIONS; GENERAL PROVISIONS- VOTING IN CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES)**

Mr. Hartman presented proposed new regulations .01 through .06 under COMAR 33.01 under the new Chapter 07- Voting in Correctional Facilities for final adoption. These proposed regulations were approved by the Board at the March 10, 2022 meeting. The proposed changes and new amendments were published in the April 22, 2022, edition of the *Maryland Register* (Vol. 49, Issue 9). The public comment period closed on May 23, 2022. No comments were received.

The proposed new regulations are:

1. 33.01.07.01 (Voting in Correctional Facilities – Definitions): The first regulation of the Chapter defines nine terms related to the regulations including election official, election-related materials, and eligible voter, which are key to the regulations.
2. 33.0107.02 (Voting in Correctional Facilities – Duties of the State Board): This regulation defines the duties of the State Board, including:
  - a. Providing a ballot drop box for the Baltimore City Central Booking facility, as required by SB 525, and written notification of how to use the drop box; and
  - b. Creating a program to notify eligible voters of how to vote in upcoming elections. Based on the number of eligible voters in each correctional facility, SBE will send each correctional facility voting information packets that contain voter registration applications, mail in ballot applications, instructions for each, and return envelopes.
3. 33.01.07.03 (Voting in Correctional Facilities – Duties of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS)): This regulation defines the responsibilities of the DPSCS, which include:
  - a. Installing and 24/7 video monitoring of the ballot drop box(es) at the Baltimore City Centralized Booking Facility and other ballot drop boxes that the Department elects to install;
  - b. Allowing eligible voters to deposit election-related materials in the drop box(es);
  - c. Providing SBE with the number of eligible voters in each State correctional facility by a specific date;
  - d. Distributing the voting information packet to eligible voters and processing all outgoing postal mail both in a timely manner so as to not delay any election processes;
  - e. Storing any excess voting information packets and notifying SBE if there is a shortage of packets; and
  - f. Allowing election officials to empty the drop box(es) at pre-determined times.

4. 33.01.07.04 (Voting in Correctional Facilities – Duties of the Local Board of Election for Baltimore City): This regulation defines the duties of the Baltimore City Board of Elections, which include emptying the drop box(es) on a regular basis and distributing an election-related materials and ballots received from the drop box(es) that should go to a different local board.
5. 33.01.07.05 (Voting in Correctional Facilities – Duties of the Local Correctional Facilities): This regulation defines the duties of local correctional facilities, which include:
  - a. Distributing the voting information packet to eligible voters and processing all outgoing postal mail both in a timely manner so as to not delay any election processes; and
  - b. Storing any excess voting information packets and notify the SBE if there is a shortage of packets.
6. 33.01.07.06 (Voting in Correctional Facilities – Duties of Eligible Voters): This regulation defines the duties of eligible voters in correctional facilities which include completing and returning all election related materials by the appropriate deadlines either by ballot drop box or through the normal outgoing postal mail process.

Mr. Williams made a motion to adopt the proposed new regulations under COMAR 33.01.07.01 through 33.01.07.06, under the new Chapter 07, as presented by Ms. Hartman. Ms. Woodward seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

#### **APPROVAL OF EMERGENCY CHANGE TO POLLING PLACES FOR BALTIMORE CITY AND BALTIMORE COUNTY**

1. Baltimore City- Ms. Duncan presented the Board with an update from the Baltimore City Board of Elections for the two requests for emergency polling place changes presented at the June 23, 2022 meeting. An email from Abigail Goldman, Deputy Director for Baltimore City Board of Elections, stated that Baltimore City Board of Elections had approved both requests. In response to a question from Mr. Voelp, Ms. Duncan confirmed that at the previous meeting, the State Board approved the polling place changes on the condition that the Baltimore City Board also authorized the polling place changes. Mr. Voelp explained that no further action from the State Board was required because the conditions of the Motion from June 23 had been met.
2. Baltimore County- Ms. Dorsey presented three requests from the Baltimore County Board of Elections to replace polling places. Those requests are:
  - a. Relocate 652 voters assigned to 10-06, Hereford Middle School located at 712 Corbett Road in Monkton, Maryland **TO** 10-02 located at Jacksonville Community Center located at 3605 Sweet Air Road in Phoenix, Maryland. The distance between the locations is 8 miles. Precinct 10-06 will be removed for the 2022 Primary Election.
  - b. Relocate 1,281 voters assigned to 11-20, Seven Oaks Elementary School located at 9220 Seven Courts Drive in Parkville, Maryland **TO** 11-17, Gunpowder Elementary School located at 9540 Holiday Manor Road in Nottingham, Maryland. The distance between the locations is 1.8 miles. Precinct 11-20 will be removed for the 2022 Primary Election.

- c. Relocate 699 voters assigned to 15-27, Martin Boulevard Elementary located at 210 Riverton Road in Middle River, Maryland **TO** 15-07, Chase Elementary School located at 11701 Eastern Avenue in Middle River, Maryland. The distance between the locations is 3.4 miles. Precinct 15-27 will be removed for the 2022 Primary Election.

SBE recommended approving these requests. Ms. Dorsey confirmed that these changes are necessary due to redistricting and that all three changes have been approved by the Baltimore County Board of Elections.

Mr. Williams made a motion to approve the emergency polling place changes as presented in Baltimore County. Ms. Woodward seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

### **CLOSED SESSION – PERSONNEL & LEGAL ADVICE**

Mr. Voelp requested a motion to close the board meeting under several provisions of §3-305(b)(7) and (8), which permit closing a meeting to receive advice from counsel and consult with staff about pending or potential litigation, respectively, of the General Provisions Article. Ms. Woodward made a motion to convene in closed session under General Provisions Article, §3-305(b)(7) and (8), and Mr. Williams seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion having passed, the Board met in closed session in accordance with exemptions defined in (b)(7) and (8) of Section 3-305 of the Open Meetings Act to receive advice from counsel and consult with staff about pending or potential litigation. The closed session began at 3:13 pm. Mr. Voelp, Mr. Funn, Mr. Miller, Ms. Woodward, and Mr. Williams attended the closed meeting. In addition to the board members, Ms. Lamone, Mr. Kobrin, Ms. Charlson, and Ms. Duncan attended the meeting.

The board received legal advice and consulted with staff about pending or potential litigation. No actions were taken.

Ms. Woodward made a motion to adjourn the closed meeting and return to the open meeting, and Mr. Miller seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. The closed meeting adjourned at 4:12 pm.

Mr. Voelp called the open meeting back to order at 4:17 pm.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

There was no old business.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

*Emergency Changes to Baltimore County Polling Places:* Ms. Lavoie clarified that Herford Middle School, Seven Oaks Elementary School, and Martin Boulevard Elementary were all previously combined polling places with a separate voting room for each precinct. She explained that only 10-06, 11-20, and 15-27 were being relocated to the new locations and that Herford Middle School, Seven Oaks Elementary School, and Martin Boulevard Elementary will remain as single-precinct polling places. In response to a question from Mr. Voelp, Ms. Lavoie confirmed that only the voters who are affected by redistricting are being moved to a new polling place.

**ANNAPOLIS (Aug. 8, 2022)** – The State Board of Elections (SBE) was notified that the Frederick County Board of Elections will decertify the results from the 2022 Primary Election and reconvene this week to rescan all mail-in and provisional ballots counted in these post-election canvasses.

While preparing for the recount for Democratic nomination for County Council District 3, the Frederick County Board of Elections discovered a discrepancy between the total number of votes in the certified results and the number of accepted mail-in and provisional ballots. This discovery triggered a further review of the ballots cast in the 2022 Primary Election. The ongoing review indicates the discrepancy is due to human errors in ballot accounting that occurred during the mail-in and provisional canvassing process. As a result of this discovery, a comprehensive review of ballot accounting documents is being performed.

SBE was first briefed about the issue on August 6, 2022, and immediately started working with the Frederick County Board of Elections to provide the equipment and support necessary to conduct the rescan. SBE will continue to collaborate with the Frederick County Board of Elections and other local boards assisting with this week's rescan of the mail-in and provisional ballots.

After the election is recertified, the State Board of Elections will work with the Frederick County Board of Elections to review its ballot accounting procedures and, where appropriate, implement best practices for ballot accounting.

## ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL'S REPORT

August 15, 2022

1. *Keegan-Ayer et. al. v. Di-Cola et. al.*, C-10-CV-22-000451 (Cir. Ct. for Frederick Cnty.). OAG and SBE are monitoring a residency challenge filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County. Incumbent Frederick County Councilmember (District 3) M.C. Keegan-Ayer filed suit against her opponent in the Democratic Primary, Jazmin Di Cola, and the Frederick County Board of Elections on August 4, 2022. The complaint alleges that Ms. Di Cola did not reside in District 3 as of July 19, 2022, the date of the primary election and seeks to order her disqualification from the race.

On August 12, 2022, the circuit court held a show cause evidentiary hearing to determine Ms. Di Cola's residency qualification. After the hearing, the Court found Ms. Di Cola did not qualify to run for the District 3 council and ordered the Frederick County Board of Elections to disqualify her from the race.

Ms. Di Cola has until August 17, 2022 to appeal the decision of the circuit court to the Court of Appeals.

2. *WinRed, Inc. v. Ellison, et al.*, No. 22-cv-1238 (8<sup>th</sup> Cir). On July 7, 2021, WinRed, Inc. – a federal PAC created to assist Republican Party candidates – filed a lawsuit against the Attorneys General of Connecticut, New York, Maryland, and Minnesota (the “State AGs”), seeking a declaration that State consumer protection statutes and regulations are preempted by federal law, to the extent that these State laws are being enforced to regulate the use of pre-checked recurring contribution boxes for solicitations for federal offices. WinRed had received letters from the defendants requesting information and documents regarding its use of pre-checked boxes in that context. (It is now public that ActBlue – the PAC formed to assist Democratic Party candidates – has received a similar request from the same State AGs, but has not joined this lawsuit.) On July 27, 2021, WinRed filed a motion for preliminary injunction against enforcement of subpoenas served by the State AGs. On July 29, 2021, the State AGs moved to dismiss the complaint. Oral argument on both motions took place on November 2, 2021. On January 26, 2022, the Court issued an order denying Plaintiff's motion for preliminary injunction and granting the defendants' motion to dismiss, and dismissed the Complaint. WinRed has appealed the dismissal to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit. On March 25, 2022, WinRed filed its opening brief. The Appellees' response was filed in late April. WinRed filed its reply brief on May 25, 2022. The Court is in the process of scheduling the appeal for oral argument.

3. *Baltimore Cnty. Branch of the NAACP, et al. v. Baltimore Cnty., Md., et al.*, No. 1:21-cv-03232 (D. Md.). On December 21, 2021, the Baltimore County Branch of the NAACP, the League of Women Voters, Common Cause of Maryland, and several individual plaintiffs filed a lawsuit challenging the Baltimore County redistricting map for county council districts, on the ground that it violated section 2 of the Voting Rights Act. Baltimore County, the individual members of the Baltimore County Council, and the Baltimore County Board of Elections were named as defendants. (The individual County Council members have since been dismissed from the case.) On January 19, 2022, the plaintiffs filed a motion for preliminary injunction, and the court entered an order setting a hearing for February 15, 2022 on the plaintiffs' motion. On February 22, 2022, the court ruled in favor of the plaintiffs, and ordered Baltimore County to produce a compliant map by March 9, 2022. On March 9, 2022, Baltimore County filed its proposed remedial map. The Court has asked the plaintiffs to respond to the filing by 5 pm today, and will hold a conference with the parties on March 11, 2022 to discuss further proceedings. On March 25, 2022, the Court approved the remedial map proposed by Baltimore County. On May 9, 2022, after reviewing status reports from the parties, the Court dismissed the matter without prejudice, to allow the plaintiffs to bring a challenge to the county map after the July 19, 2022 election if they determine that a challenge is warranted, and to file a motion to attorneys' fees by June 6, 2022.

On June 6, 2022, the plaintiffs filed a Motion for Attorney's Fees and Litigation Expenses. The Court has stayed the proceedings relating to the award of attorney's fees until September 6, 2022. The case is otherwise closed.

4. *In the Matter of Seth Wilson*, No. C-02-CV-22-000078 (Cir. Ct. A.A. Cnty.). On January 14, 2022, Seth Wilson, the Chairman of the Washington County Republican Party Central Committee, filed a petition for administrative mandamus of the determination and approval, respectively, by the Washington County Board of Elections and SBE, of the locations for early voting centers in Washington County for the 2022 elections. On January 19, 2022, the agencies were provided notice of the petition for administrative mandamus by the Clerk of the court. On March 22, 2022, the agencies filed administrative records. Mr. Wilson has filed his memorandum of law in support of his petition. The State and Local Boards have filed answering memoranda. Mr. Wilson filed a reply memorandum on June 16, 2022. A hearing on the petition has been scheduled for August 15, 2022.

Dear Ms. Antoine, Ms. Cruise, and Ms. Leonard:

Thank you for your email letter dated August 4, 2022, in which you identify issues from the 2022 Primary Election and make recommendations for future elections.

Before responding to each of the identified issues and specific recommendations in your letter, I offer some preliminary observations about the 2022 Primary Election and a general response to your letter. First, the 2022 Primary Election was an extraordinarily difficult election. Election preparation activities were delayed for months awaiting final congressional, legislative, and for most local boards, county redistricting plans. The delays prevented the local boards from starting work that is typically done months before an election, until several weeks before the election. This work includes finalizing their election day polling places, identifying how many election judges would be needed and assigning them, allocating equipment and supplies, notifying voters of changes to their districts and election day polling places, and of course, adjusting to the revised election calendar. In the days leading up to the election, every local board of elections reported a higher than normal "call out" rate of election judges. Some experienced judges contracted COVID-19 while working early voting, while other election judges reported that they were unable to serve at the last minute. These last-minute cancellations required that the local boards revisit assignments and where possible, shuffle assignments so election day polling places could open on time. I share this information **not** to provide excuses but to share the environment in which State and local election officials were operating.

Second, I agree with the core recommendations in the letter - that is, the importance of having comprehensive, layered systems with quality assurance, risk management, and accountability. The State and local boards have and will continue to have such plans in place and identify areas for improvement. While there are always areas for improvement in such a complex operation, the foundation of election administration is rooted in multiple layers of quality assurance, contingency planning, managing risks, and when appropriate, holding personnel and contractors accountable.

In this letter, you identify specific issues and provide recommendations. Responses to each issue are below.

1. A voter's party information was visible on the mail-in ballot envelope.

Response: SBE followed and will continue to follow the State's procurement laws and procedures when selecting the vendors. After a competitive procurement and reviewing sample ballots, ballot packets, and technical and financial proposals from six vendors susceptible for award, SBE selected Taylor Communications to print, insert and mail ballot packets for the 2022 elections.

The proofs SBE reviewed did not contain the party abbreviations. Upon learning that the first shipment of mail-in ballot packets contained this information, SBE requested that Taylor immediately cease printing this information. Once SBE provided this instruction, no subsequent ballot packets included this party abbreviations. SBE has already implemented a new process for reviewing and approving the data layout on the mail-in ballot packets for future elections.

With regard to your comments about printing vendors, the State's procurement process has a preference for Maryland-based vendors, but it does not outweigh other important considerations, such as experience, capacity, and pricing. For years, SBE has tried to cultivate Maryland-based printers for ballots, but printing ballots is a complex, highly precise, and therefore high-risk printing process. Maryland-based printers have typically declined to pursue these procurement opportunities and when they have bid on procurements, they do not have experience with printing ballots. That being said, however, it is not clear how awarding this contract to a Maryland-based vendor would have prevented this from occurring.

SBE uses all available contractual remedies when a vendor does not meet a contract's requirements and assigns resources based on the complexity of the project and contract.

2. Baltimore City voters were placed in the wrong districts.

Response: Following the recent redistricting process, local boards of elections assigned more than 4 million voters to newly drawn districts in compliance with Maryland's latest congressional and legislative maps. Despite the complexity inherent in every statewide redistricting, more than 99.9% of all registered voters in Maryland were assigned to the correct legislative and congressional districts at the conclusion of the process.

Redistricting changes resulted in some Baltimore City voters being placed in the incorrect districts and receiving incorrect voter information and ballots. This was a result of manual changes made by the Baltimore City Board of Elections in a short time frame, due to delayed Census data and district lines and the resulting litigation. Errors were identified in a review performed by SBE, and corrective measures were put in place. This included notifying the affected voters, issuing the correct mail-in ballots, and

providing a list of affected voters to the precincts with affected votes. The Baltimore City Board of Elections will provide affected voters with a corrected voter registration card, and these voters will be in the correct districts for the upcoming general election and all future elections.

3. Duplicate ballots sent to voters.

Response: This issue was immediately addressed with the vendor. The vendor identified the cause of the duplicate ballot issuance - which was less than 0.2% of the almost 500,000 ballot packets sent in the 2022 Primary Election - and corrected the issue to prevent a similar occurrence in the future. A letter was promptly sent to all voters who received duplicate ballots, instructing them how to proceed with the duplicate ballot.

4. Incorrect sample ballots sent.

The Queen Anne's and Calvert County Boards of Elections provided accurate data to the vendor and proofed and reviewed the vendors' sample ballots. The vendors, however, used certain data fields incorrectly and this led to voters receiving the wrong ballot information in their sample ballot. Upon discovering the mistake, the vendors immediately notified voters that, due to a technical issue, some voters in those jurisdictions received an incorrect sample ballot and new sample ballots were printed and mailed. The corrected sample ballots included a note that they were "corrected" on the outside.

The issue with the Prince George's County sample ballots was caused by incorrect data being sent to the printer by the local board of elections. The Prince George's County Board of Elections plans to add additional proofing steps before approving sample ballots in future elections. Similarly, this error was immediately corrected and the affected voters were issued new sample ballots, marked as "corrected."

5. Wrong party ballots sent.

Response: SBE has not been made aware of this situation by voters, and the letter did not include information to enable us to look into the report. Please provide additional information so that SBE can adequately respond.

6. Voting machine issues.

Response: The ballot marking devices can only display a certain number of candidates' names (or pair of candidates' names in the case of the Governor/Lt. Governor contest) and the number of candidates' names that can be displayed on one screen is defined by the voting system's software. With the current software, the names of seven candidates can be displayed on one screen; if there are more than seven candidates in a contest, the names of the candidates will be displayed over two or more screens. This has been the case since the voting system was first used in Maryland in 2016.

State and local election officials test and proof the ballot marking devices with the same level of rigor that ballots for in-person voting and mail-in ballots are proofed. To ensure that all candidates have an equal opportunity for their names to be seen by all voters, the ballot marking devices require that voters look at each screen in a contest and alert voters if they try to move to the next contest without viewing all listed candidates. If a contest has more than one screen of candidate names, there is a yellow "More" bar at the bottom of the screen to alert voters to additional candidate names and a blue "More" bar at the top of subsequent screens to instruct the voter on how to return to the previous list of candidates. Additionally, instructions on how to navigate within a contest and between contests are included in sample ballots mailed to voters and posted at each ballot marking device.

As we do after each election, we will provide an election overview at an upcoming State Board meeting and in a post-election report. Prior reports have included recommendations and new processes, and the report for the 2022 Primary Election will include the same.

Dear Administrators and Board Members of the State Board of Elections:

Since 2004, the ACLU of Maryland, Common Cause Maryland, and many of our partners in the Everyone Votes Maryland coalition have worked across the state and in collaboration with the Maryland State Board of Elections (SBE) to ensure every Marylander can exercise their fundamental right to vote. We write in the service of what Maryland voters and our democracy deserve: a well-resourced election system run by proactive, engaged elections administrators, board members that govern with passion about voting rights and with an understanding of the myriad barriers to voting that exist for some people, and a transparent process that promises clarity, equity, and accountability.

While this letter is intended to outline our organizations' concerns and recommendations following the 2022 Primary election, we want to applaud the SBE for maintaining an open line of communication with our organizations and working collaboratively with the Everyone Votes coalition, despite the turmoil of the pandemic and redistricting.

Many of these errors were the fault of local boards of election, in addition to vendors contracted by either SBE or local boards. The law is clear that the local boards and staff are accountable to the State Board of Elections. We recognize that the law does not provide specific accountability mechanisms for holding the local boards and their staff accountable; therefore, our call for accountability includes a call to elected officials to fix the culture of shrugging shoulders whenever vendors, local boards, or SBE make mistakes that impact voters.

We detail the specific, undisputed mistakes made below, but these mistakes are the consequence of broader systemic issues: 1) inadequate planning; 2) human error and a lack of systems to catch errors; 3) insufficient transparency and communication, and 4) lack of accountability. We learned of the errors listed below through various public sources, coalition partners, and our Election Protection hotlines. It should be no surprise to SBE staff that our organizations are concerned about process issues and mistakes that create confusion and mistrust. When it comes to voting, confusion and mistrust lead to voter disenfranchisement.

### **Serious Problems and Specific Recommendations**

The following is a list of issues that were brought to our attention during the primary season:

- 1) Mail-in ballot envelope printing error:** The mail-in ballot envelope reveals the voters' party information in a code visible in the window of the envelope.

**Recommendation:** Require staff and vendors run quality control proofs that stakeholders carefully review before printing and mailing in bulk. If not done already, SBE should work to secure a state-based vendor. Stakeholders should include staff of the state and local boards of elections and representatives of historically disenfranchised populations for equity, accessibility and accountability considerations. There should be thorough vetting, high standards, and accountability for vendors. We suggest designating a SBE staff member to be ultimately responsible for quality control for all printed and mailed materials.

- 2) Baltimore City voters put in the wrong districts:** 150 voters in Districts 43A and 45 were assigned to the incorrect district. In a statement to the Baltimore Brew, SBE said the issue occurred because redistricting requires making manual changes in the database and four streets were not moved into the correct precinct. On Primary Day, at least two voters in 43A/45 reported getting the wrong ballot (the ballot for the other district) at their polling site, suggesting that this issue was never resolved. In District 41, 212 voters were initially sent correct ballots, then they received a notice that their ballots were incorrect and they received new ballots, then they received another notice explaining that the second ballots sent to them were actually incorrect (and the first ballots were, in fact, correct all along).

**Recommendation:** There must be accountability for these egregious mistakes. Create quality control processes to test and review voter rolls, district changes, and other voter registration files and databases. In redistricting years, there should be a comprehensive review process once voters have been reassigned to new districts conducted by a person or team other than those who did the reassignments. This U.S. Election Assistance Commission [Guide to Redistricting](#) is a helpful resource for best redistricting practices. The voters in the affected districts should be contacted and reassured that they have been assigned to the correct precinct before the General Election.

- 3) Duplicate ballots sent to voters:** In early July, about 800 voters in Montgomery County were mailed duplicate ballots. SBE confirmed that 142 voters in 10 other counties were also mailed duplicate ballots.

**Recommendation:** Investigate how this happened and add layers of review to prevent duplicate ballots being mailed to voters. If it was the fault of the vendor, hold them accountable.

- 4) Incorrect sample ballots sent:** In Prince George’s County, about 10,000 voters received incorrect sample ballots as a result of a printing mistake. In Queen Anne’s County, registered voters received Republican sample ballots regardless of their registered party affiliation. In Calvert County, the vendor made a coding error that caused 20,000 voters to receive the wrong party’s sample ballot.

**Recommendation:** Carefully proof and review all mail from state and local boards of elections. Every mistake risks confusion and mistrust in our voting systems. Provide the highest quality production for every mailer and every mailing list.

- 5) Wrong party ballots sent:** In Howard County, voters reported receiving a Republican mail-in ballot, even though they are registered Democrats. Those voters were able to go to the local board of elections to get replacement ballots, but we don’t know how many voters were impacted.

**Recommendation:** Investigate how this happened and implement measures to ensure it doesn’t happen again (in Howard Co. or anywhere else.).

- 6) Voting machine issues:** In Montgomery County, the ballot marking devices split races with eight or more candidates into multiple pages, sometimes just leaving one candidate on the second page. The subsequent pages did not have information indicating which race the candidate was part of. While this issue was reported in Montgomery County, this is a statewide issue and races in other jurisdictions also impacted.

**Recommendation:** Similar to paper mail and ballots, proof and test electronic versions of ballots and forms, including the electronic ballots displayed in the ES&S Express Vote ballot marking devices. Conduct the review through an equity and accessibility lens, or engage stakeholders who can, in order to mitigate viewing as someone who is familiar with voting machines, voting systems, and what is on the ballot. A sample of the electronic ballot should also be made available to candidates and voters. This U.S. Election Assistance Commission [Guide to Designing Usable Ballots](#) contains additional recommendations such as giving candidates fair space on the ballot and ensuring the contest header on the ballot is more prominent than the candidates’ names to ensure maximum voter comprehension.

### **Core Recommendations**

It is crucial that comprehensive, layered systems are created to prevent mistakes; including quality assurance procedures, risk management measures, and staff accountability through clear roles and responsibilities for protecting voters from preventable mistakes.

When mistakes do occur, investigate their causes and ensure results are shared with and explained to the public, and hold those responsible accountable. Without these measures, the

public cannot be assured that the same or similar problems will not occur in the future. Maryland voters deserve a detailed explanation of the errors listed above (and any others), to include what happened, how it happened, and what will be done to prevent it from happening again. This report should be in writing or made verbally at a public SBE meeting, before the General Election. We also encourage including recommendations, if any, for specific local boards of election where greater oversight and accountability is necessary.

Finally, we are requesting that the State Board of Elections and all local boards of elections devise a comprehensive plan with layers of oversight, audits, emergency/contingency planning, logistics, and outreach for the November election. Contingency plans should be robust, anticipating all possible issues that might arise throughout the process. Errors, late openings, and long lines are problems every election year. We know there will always be challenges, but we must do better at anticipating and preventing issues to deliver a smooth, safe, accessible, and equitable election.

We are happy to schedule time to discuss the specifics of this letter and are committed to supporting these efforts where possible.

I am writing to ask that you extend the deadline to cure ballots for web-delivery ballots. Web-delivery ballots, unlike the standard mail-in ballots, contain the signature and the ballot in one envelope. Therefore, the presence or absence of a signature cannot be determined until the web-delivery envelope is opened by the canvass teams. The cure deadline was Friday, July 29 10 am and not all the web-delivery ballots in Montgomery County had been opened by then; in fact, canvass teams are continuing to open them.

I am writing to ask that you provide these voters the same provisions all other mail-in voters in this state received - that the Board must notify these voters as soon as possible, and that they would have ten days to cure, in order to give voters a chance to have their vote counted. I realize that this is an unusual request but I believe it is important to ensure that as many votes as possible are counted.

## Maryland State Board of Elections,

I am filing a formal complaint concerning Washington County Maryland's Circuit Court primary election, in July 2022. My inquiry and complaint into the Circuit Court election process was prompted by my disabled Son, being told he could vote for either of the Candidates for Circuit court judge, in November, as he was an unaffiliated voter and not eligible for voting in the current primary. An adequate effort was not made to communicate this to him as a disabled individual and proved to be untrue, as per later research revealed. As I inquired into the election laws, the rules presented or researched, could be described as obscure and weak, at best.

Here are my complaints:

1. Lack of explanation of election process to a disabled voter.
2. An inability of Washington County Board of Elections or Maryland State Board of Elections to describe a Circuit Court position as partisan or non partisan.
3. If nonpartisan (as intended from reading) election disenfranchised Green and Libertarian party voters.
4. If not nonpartisan election, WashCoBOE and MDBOE, couldn't cite law allowing the Republican candidates to run on Democratic party ballot and vice versa & not include other recognized Maryland parties voters.
5. MD court of appeals changed the filing deadlines without the Maryland Constitution Authority to do so. Filing deadlines are to be extended only by the General assembly, as per MD law. The incumbent, didnt file within original framework-of the law.
6. An endorsement made to one candidate's campaign allegedly violates campaign finance rules, by not claiming an endorsement by Maryland Barr Association as a campaign contribution.

These issues combined with a lack of public public outreach by both the State and County board of elections, concerning a change of law in 1/2021, concerning Circuit Court positions, prompt me to ask for a legislative review as per MD Constitution Art 4, sect 12, as a contended election.

Although this specific complaint is not challenging the concerns of the unaffiliated voters disenfranchised in this election, it is also an issue that suppressed a population of 22,000+ voters in Washington County's July Primary election. The unaffiliated population has been called on by the MD court of appeals to be remedied in past decisions, but the posture of the rules makers, has yet to address.

I look forward to the Board's initiation of self correction action in this situation and or the MBOE filing the dispute with MD's legislature.

# Title 33 STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS

## Subtitle 11 ABSENTEE BALLOTS

### Chapter 04 Canvass of Ballots – Procedures

Authority: Election Law Article, §§2-102(b)(4), 9-303, 11-301, and 11-302

#### **.04 Hold Back of Ballots.**

A. Required Hold Back. Except as provided in §B of this regulation, to preserve the secrecy of provisional ballots and absentee ballots, the local board shall withhold, from the initial canvass[:

(1) At] *at* least five absentee ballots of each ballot style to be canvassed during the provisional ballot canvass]; and

(2) At least five absentee ballots of each ballot style to be canvassed during the second absentee ballot canvass].

B. If, at the start of the initial canvass, a local board has received five or less absentee ballots of a specific ballot style, the local board shall withhold all of the ballots of that ballot style until the final canvass.

C. Later Canvasses. The absentee ballots withheld under this regulation shall be included and canvassed with the[:

(1) Provisional] *provisional* ballots]; or

(2) Timely ballots later received on or before the deadline for absentee ballots].

**Explanation:** The proposed changes remove the requirement that the local boards hold back ballots for the final canvass and means that the local boards can count more ballots in the first canvass of mail-in ballots. With the large increase in the number of mail-in ballots, the secrecy of mail-in ballots is preserved due to the large increase in the number of mail-in ballots.

- The fee will cause undue financial hardship, if the liability of the fine is the personal responsibility of the officers.
- Computer problems occurred which made timely filing impossible. However, the filer still must have demonstrated a good faith effort to timely file.

Prior to the meeting please review each waiver request. Note the recommendations that you may disagree with or have questions on that you would like to discuss.

Pursuant to Election Law Article §13-337 (b) (3), the State Administrator has denied two- waiver request, for the month of June. No Board action is required on the denials. Late fees collected year to date for Late Fee Waivers are \$62,255.58.

I am writing this email to request a waiver for late filing fees to the Talbot County School Board campaign for Jymil Thompson, **CCF ID# 01014446**. I have recently taken over as treasurer for Jymil's campaign (I started June 23rd) and learned that the campaign had incurred serious fees associated with late filing of the Campaign Finance Report for the June 14th filing:

REPORT DUE DATE: 06/14/2022  
REPORT NAME: 2022 PRE-PRIMARY1 GUBERNATORIAL  
TRANSACTION PERIOD: This report must include all transactions since your last reporting through 06/07/2022

I have recently filed the Affidavit of Limited Contributions and Expenditures (ALCE) for the 06/14/2022 Pre-Primary1 Gubernatorial Report period, so we should not be incurring any additional daily fines to our account. However, I would also like to request a waiver for some or all these late fees for the following reasons.

First, there have been no transactions, donations, expenditures, etc on this campaign (besides any fees assoc. w/ initial campaign setup). So, the late filing on 6/14 wasn't because of issues with contributions/expenditures etc. The late filing was simply the result of the previous (now removed) treasurer forgetting to simply file the ALCE on time. The previous treasurer failed to fulfill his most basic duties (delinquent and non-communicative) so we feel that the Campaign could be given some relief in this instance.

Second, we are a new campaign (Jymil is a first time candidate to local/state elections), there have been no transactions yet as I said (the campaign is just getting started), and the campaign is composed of people that have no prior experience in running for any local/state office. This is my first time as a treasurer for any campaign. So, given that we are new, and had an unfortunate start to the campaign with a delinquent treasurer, we are asking for some relief on the late filing fees incurred. Since we have no contributions yet (campaign balance is zero), we would have to pay these fees out-of-pocket.

In summary, we are a new campaign with no prior campaign experience for anyone involved, with significant late fees incurred from a previous (delinquent) treasurer. I am asking for a waiver from these late fees because the campaign is just now getting off the ground, and the fees (\$735) are very burdensome to our ability to function as a campaign going forward. Of course we acknowledge that the candidate could have been more aware of campaign finance requirements and filing deadlines and pushed the former treasurer to file paperwork on time. However, that treasurer was non-communicative or said things were taken care of when they weren't. As the new treasurer, I'm asking for relief from these fees so that we can have a fresh start for the campaign and conduct our work in an on-time and efficient manner going forward. We regret not filing the appropriate forms on time in the past and will make sure that this doesn't happen again.
