



The amendment requires the Governor to nclude in the annual State Budget, as supplemental funding for prekindergarten hrough grade 12 in public schools, the revenues from video lottery operation licenses and any other commercial gaming dedicated o public education in an amount above the evel of State funding for education in public schools provided by the Bridge to Excellence n Public Schools Act of 2002 (otherwise known as the Thornton legislation) in not less han the following amounts: \$125 million in iscal year 2020; \$250 million in fiscal year 2021; \$375 million in fiscal year 2022; and 00% of commercial gaming revenues dedicated to public education in fiscal year 2023 and each fiscal year thereafter. The amendment also requires the Governor to show in the annual budget how the revenues from video lottery operation licenses and other commercial gaming are being used in a nanner that is in addition to the level of State unding for public education provided by the unding formulas established by the Bridge to Excellence in Public Schools Act.
